EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES



Since 1988 Whitewater Community Television (WCTV) has served Richmond and Wayne County with Public, Education, and Government (PEG) Access center services. It has never been easy, but when you talk to current and past staff members, volunteers, show hosts, and producers, they will tell you it has been rewarding. That feeling of being hard but rewarding has probably doubled, if not tripled, during the past fiscal year due to the dynamic nature of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

We are grateful for the work done in the past and present by staff, board members, volunteers, show hosts, and producers, which has allowed us to be a trusted local resource during a rough time for our community. We have missed having our show hosts and their guests in the studio regularly. We have missed meeting new people, the conversations before and after program recording sessions, and finding out more about how residents and organizations help make Wayne County “a great place to work, live and play” (thanks, Michael). Despite missing many of our in-person interactions, we are thankful for the technology and dedicated individuals who have helped WCTV overcome the challenges and continue achieving our mission.

Based on how we have served the community over the past 32 years, government leaders and public health officials looked to WCTV to help disseminate complete information on openings, closings, and changes in rules. WCTV worked hard to provide as up-to-date and accurate information as possible during a time when information changed often.

In addition to providing information to the community, many of our local not-for-profit organizations turned to WCTV for help with creating virtual pieces to showcase the work they were doing and help them raise money. Congregations also needed us to continue providing a means for residents to hear words of comfort, joy, prayer, and song without going to the church building. Some of our local arts organizations came to us for help with continuing to entertain our community in a safe and fun way. Requests also came in to cover some live local sports events, and we hosted the River States Conference live-streamed tournament draw in our studio.

There was lots more that happened this past year, and on behalf of Ryan, Michele, Stephen, Wes, Katlyn, and Brandon, we hope that something we have tried to do has touched you and the rest of our community.

As you review the enclosed WCTV 2020-2021 fiscal year report, I hope you will find that much of what we were asked to do, we did, as always. All of this was made possible through the dedication of the WCTV team, our board members, and with a little help from our friends (thank you John and Paul).

Speaking of friends, I would like to say THANK YOU to all the local town clerks and boards who continued to meet on Zoom and let us record, or who recorded for us (Susan), and all the essential workers who remained on the front lines despite the uncertainty that this past year brought with it.

Whitewater Community Television is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization founded in 1988. WCTV provides Wayne County, Indiana with Public, Education, and Government access services.

- **Mission statement:** We believe that quality public access television is crucial to the free exchange of information and ideas necessary for a dynamic, growing and learning community. WCTV will serve Wayne County with news, event coverage and educational and entertainment programming. Through strong links with the community, WCTV will provide professional, efficient, quality service to its viewers.
- **Vision:**
 - To strengthen the fabric of our community life by enabling open communication.
 - To provide quality access television, which is crucial to the free exchange of information and ideas necessary for a growing and learning community.
 - Through optimal use of our programming, reflect the diversity and interests of the Wayne County Community and its residents.
- **Core Beliefs:** Because Wayne County does not have a commercial television station, Whitewater Community Television serves as an outlet for information and education.  - Live broadcasts and recorded video productions including coverage of local elections, events, and other important happenings around Wayne County.

 - Access to local video production and editing services, studio facilities, equipment, and technical expertise.
 - Production of [Public Service Announcements](#) for local government and non-profit groups to help share their important messages throughout our community.
 - Community, Education and Government [Bulletin Boards](#) for publicizing local events and announcements on television between regularly scheduled programming.



- **Funding:** Funding and support for Whitewater Community Television comes from a variety of sources including:

- Franchise Fees through Wayne County Government and the City of Richmond.
- Indiana University East.
- Grants, Membership Fees and Donations.
- Fundraising and Underwriting/Sponsorships.
- Production and Editing for Hire.

- **Governance:** WCTV's Board of Directors consists of 21 three-year positions and three one-year presidential appointments. During FY20-21, two non-voting liaison positions were added to be filled by one Wayne County Commissioners and the Mayor of Richmond.. Board members are a diverse group of private citizens representing many different sectors and communities throughout Wayne County.
- **Membership:** Whitewater Community Television's [membership program](#) is open to all individuals, organizations and businesses. Memberships are good for one calendar year and all members have voting privileges during our annual meeting. WCTV's membership this past year included 56 individuals/families, 17 non-profit organizations and 4 businesses.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

I started interning at WCTV in September of 2020, which feels like a lifetime ago. Yet, at the same time, I feel like my time at the studio has flown by faster than I can even comprehend. Despite that, I still learned so much about the television and film industry as well as some skills that I can use in the workforce. I've always had a fondness for the film format and the art of video-making. For years, my mind has been set on pursuing a career in this field and my experience at WCTV has cemented that in my mind. I learned the finer details of video-making such as camerawork, editing video, coloring video, and how

to be a good on-camera personality. Everyone at the studio played a role in helping me learn these skills but I owe Steve Bahnweg and Ryan Harris a particular debt of gratitude. From the beginning, Steve and Ryan have been friendly faces and helping hands in my work. They have served as mentors to me and have made me not only a better video maker, but a better worker all around. For that, I thank them and everyone at the studio sincerely.

I've made little videos in the past with some editing in them ranging from silly home videos to commercials for small businesses. While at the studio, I was put to the test and embarked on my biggest video project yet. My assignment from Eric was to craft a 28-minute-long video of a topic of my choosing. At first, the task seemed daunting, but I quickly realized the opportunity that I had been given. With that in mind, I began working on a video which highlighted three non-profit organizations in Richmond. As always, everyone was very helpful and patient with me during production. At the end, I had made something I was proud of and had an opportunity to present myself in a way I haven't before.

That's how I can best summarize my experience, *opportunity*. This internship has been a large opportunity for me to grow in my skills, to show people what I have to offer, and to work with some amazing and talented individuals. Though I may be parting ways from the studio for now, I hope this isn't the last time I step foot in WCTV. PROGRAMMING HIGHLIGHTS

WCTV operates three television stations on the local Comcast cable network providing the community with local updates and information including live broadcasts, local election coverage, community produced programs, and access to events, government meetings and other important happenings in and around Wayne County.

WCTV also offers training and educational experiences, video production and editing services, and access to equipment, studio facilities, and technical expertise.

WCTV Channel 21 (Public Access)

Our public access station is dedicated to airing locally produced programs which are created by diverse individuals, groups, and organizations within our community. WCTV Channel 21 community producers are encouraged to create non-commercial content that freely expresses their opinions and points of view. Whitewater Community Television provides community producers with channel access, and some technical assistance, but does not exercise creative or editorial control except over unprotected speech and obscenity.

New Programs: WCTV Channel 21 welcomed two new community produced programs during fiscal year 2020-2021:

- *Beyond the Church Walls:* Created and hosted by Pastor Martel Winburn, this bi-weekly program features sermons, community insights, and informative interviews with local guests.
- *Future Achievers:* Carl Rhinehart, co-founder of FutureAchivers.org, produces and hosts this bi-weekly program featuring interviews with successful locally connected people to inspire youth and others.

Ongoing Series Programming: More than 20 local individuals, organizations and groups continued providing weekly and bi-weekly programs created within Wayne County for broadcast on WCTV Channel 21.

WETV Channel 20 (Education Access)

This station focuses on educating and entertaining our community. Programs include local school concerts, events, sports, and regular series programs hosted by community volunteers. You will also find programs created by local high school and college students. WETV Channel 20 is available on Comcast cable throughout most of Wayne County, and can be live streamed via [WETV Online](#). Regular series programming is also available on [WCTV's YouTube Channel](#).

WETV Regular Series Programs for FY20-21

Access to the Arts: This program, typically hosted by Eric Marsh or Dave Paxton, focuses on the arts in Wayne County through on location interviews, performances and more. Due to impacts of the pandemic on local arts organizations, this show was “paused” after recording one episode during FY20-21. This show is expected to restart during FY21-22.

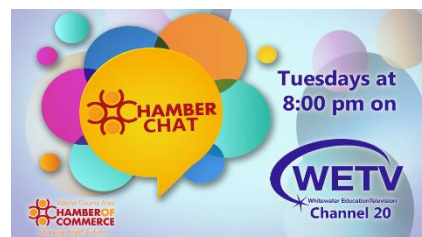
Brain Mechanics: This show is hosted by Matt Duffin, former sportswriter for the Western Wayne News and a survivor of a traumatic brain injury. Featured guests include medical practitioners, survivors, and caregivers providing inspiration and hope to those in our community suffering with the effects of traumatic brain injury.

Chamber Chat: Hosted by Melissa Vance and guest host Roxie Deer of [Wayne County Area Chamber of Commerce](#), this show provided information on local businesses, initiatives, events, and other current topics. The Chamber partnered with [HYPE Wayne County](#) and chose to discontinue recording *Chamber Chat* during FY20-21, in favor of creating a new show to highlight Wayne County's young professionals entitled “*Together*”.

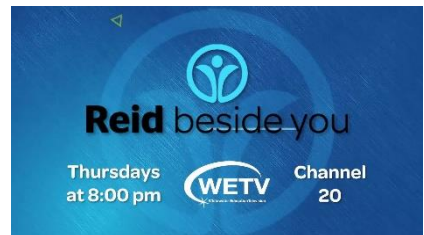

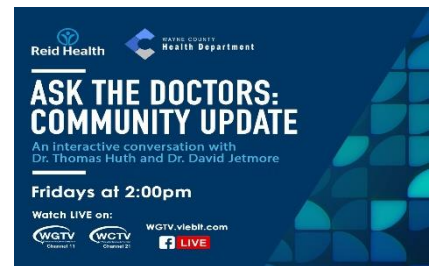

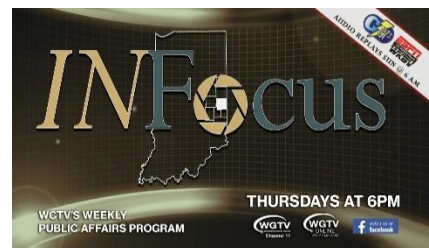
WGTV Regular Series Programs for FY20-21

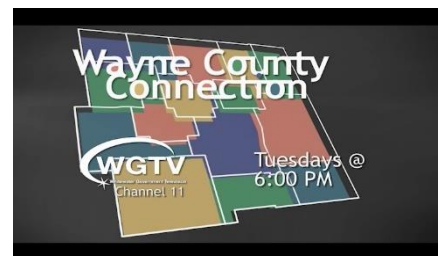

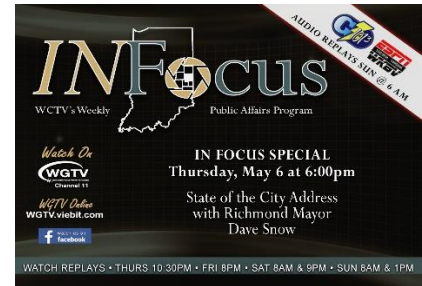
